African Studies on Part-time



Part-time studies at the Centre of African Studies

Paying part-time non-degree seeking students can sign up for one or several courses at the Centre of African Studies (CAS). Part-time studies at CAS gives the student an opportunity to gain insight into and understanding of Africa in terms of its development, religion and social and cultural conditions, and offers the opportunity to gain linguistic competencies in Kiswahili.

Student profile

Individuals who are interested in Africa and who seek continuing education at university level, e.g. employees of NGOs, the foreign and diplomatic service, or international organisations (e.g. the UN system), as well as consultants, journalists, nurses and teachers.

Competence profile

Part-time studies at CAS provides ambitious private- and public-sector staff with the opportunity to pursue interdisciplinary and internationally oriented continuing education. The study aims to provide in-depth insights into the social and developmental challenges faced by Africa, as well as its religious and cultural conditions. The aim of the courses run by CAS is to develop the participants' ability to work across disciplines in order to take part in co-operative situations that involve a range of different academic and professional competences.

Part-time studies

Courses at the Centre for African Studies are interdisciplinary, with a particular emphasis on the social-science and humanities disciplines. Part-time students are able to choose between all of the thematic courses on offer at CAS and Kiswahili. The courses have a value of either 10 or 15 ECTS. Part-time students participate in the ordinary teaching of African Studies, in the form of daytime courses that run on weekdays, either over a semester or during the summer. The teaching is in English. A more in-depth description of the teaching, courses and exams is available in the study curriculum, which can be found on the website.

Admission

Admission to part-time non-degree studies is conditional upon entrance qualifications corresponding to at least a professional bachelor, a bachelor degree or a diploma regulated by executive order.

The deadline for applications for admission to part-time non-degree studies starting in February is 1 January. The deadline for applications for admission to a course starting in September is 1 August. The application form is available on the website.

Student fees

Participation in part-time studies at CAS is contingent upon payment of fees set by The Faculty of Theology. The current fees for citizens from Denmark, Scandinavia and EU/EEA countries are DDK 2,000 for a course of 10 ECTS and DDK 3,00 for a course of 15 ECTS.
